#### Greetings Scouts and Scouters!

Welcome to the 2017 CT Dist. Fall Camporee. Our theme for this event is "FRIENDSHIP." Preplanning will be necessary and will allow both youth and adult leaders an opportunity to practice skills. Emphasis is placed on "<u>friendship</u>". We will commonly use the <u>E.D.G.E.</u> method of training in various activities.

Pre-registration is required for this camporee, as it will provide your unit with a Camporee packet containing patches and information necessary for an enjoyable experience. Upon arrival at Camp Hatcher North, checkin at registration to receive your Camporee packet, and proceed to your campsite to set up for the event. The normal campground amenities are available. Port-a Johns will be positioned throughout the campsites. Potable water should be available barring unforeseen emergencies.

Low impact camping and "Leave No Trace" are the key concepts. Use the normal campsite inspection guide as your standard. We may add some specific items such as "Construction Materials" to the list (explained at Round Tables).

Pre-registration \$15.00 is required, <u>please</u>. An additional \$5.00 per head processing fee will be charged to units not pre-registered (total \$20.00). So please register by the deadline!!!

On behalf of the Camporee and District Committees, we hope your experience with the various events is a positive one. We wish you well as you continue your preparations. We will be discussing and explaining event details at upcoming Boy Scout Round Tables. Your Unit Commissioners have details and are a vital resource for your units.

#### Guidelines

Registration Pre-Registration is \$15.00 per person. Pre-registration is required in

order to assemble each unit's Camporee Packet. All participants must

be registered members of the BSA (any program).

Health Forms Double check that you have updated medical forms in your files and

with you during the Camporee.

Youth Protection Assure that all members of your unit are current with their youth

protection training.

Rosters All units <u>must furnish</u> an updated roster of <u>all participants</u> at check-in.

Unpaid add on members can be registered and paid at this time.

Permission Forms All units are required to have a current permission slip for each Scout

in attendance. Parental permission is required for most types of

emergency treatment at a medical facility. These forms should be kept in the Troop Campsite and readily available in case of an emergency.

**Campsite** 

Assignments First come, first served. Use "Leave No Trace Guidelines."

Parking Parking can be a challenge. Please limit the number of vehicles you

bring to the event. Designated parking areas will be marked for your use – we must assist each other. Extreme caution is needed at all times.

Traffic Control Exercise caution at all times. Be alert and avoid parking, even for a

brief time, on the main road through camp (emergency vehicles may be

needed). Follow the camp staff member's directions.

Uniforms We are a uniformed organization. Uniforms are a means of

communication! Any other questions?

Leadership Adequate and appropriate adult and youth leadership is essential.

Two-deep adult leadership is a BSA requirement.

First Aid Each unit should have its own first aid kit sized to treat their unit in an

emergency. A first aid station will be located in or near the

administration building. All injuries no matter how minor shall be

reported to the first aid station.

Latrines Port-a-johns will be provided and located throughout the camp.

Throwing of trash in the units is unacceptable and results in excess

rental fees.

Trash/Garbage There is no trash service at this camp. You are asked to separate your

aluminum recyclables. The OA will recycle them and donate the proceeds to OWLS. Leave the campsite better than you found it.

Security and Fire Safety

To reduce the number of unauthorized persons visiting your campsite, it is recommended that at least one person (preferably an adult) remain in the campsite at all times. The proper use of fire and fire prevention is of the utmost importance. All units are expected to maintain a fire safe campsite at all times. Set up a fire fighting station, have a plan, use

it. It is a campsite inspection requirement.

Water Potable water is available at the various spigots located throughout the

campgrounds.

Fuel Firewood is not provided. <u>Do not cut trees</u>. Current BSA policies on

the use of chemical, liquid, gaseous, or jellied fuels apply. Ref: Guide

to Safe Scouting and the Scoutmasters Handbook.

Patches Patches will be ordered for pre-registered participants, only and will be

provided in the Camporee Packets.

**Campsite** 

Maintenance Practice "Leave No Trace" camping. Remove all trash and do not

leave firewood that you brought to the event. Members of the staff will visit your campsite to assist with any questions you may have and to

offer constructive suggestions.

Religious Services A non-denominational religious service will be provided after morning

be organized into patrols or joined with their Boy Scout Troop Patrols to participate in the events. Participation in the various events will be by Troop and Patrol. The normal BSA policies regarding parent attendance will be observed. All BSA rules and policies apply to these

#### **Events and Procedures**

### **Uniform Inspection Guidelines and Miscellaneous Items**

The Friday evening uniform inspection will be held under Bob Howard Lodge and the McCain Training Building. The BSA uniform inspection sheet will be used as the guide for the inspection. The new uniform may present some challenges but judging will be as consistent as possible. Being prepared is the key to success at inspections!

PLEASE NOTE: Each Scout who brings a non-perishable food item to the inspection can earn 10 points per item for a <u>maximum 100 bonus points for his patrol</u>. These items will be given to a local food bank and should assist with the ongoing food drives.

Troop Campsites – Will be evaluated for eco-friendliness (e.g. minimum use of throw away materials; minimum trash generated; leave no trace techniques etc.). Campsites will be inspected per the Croatan Trails campsite inspection form. A copy of the form has been provided for you at the end of this document. # **Competitive Events**

#### **COREE Human Foosball: Patrol Activity**

This will be a patrol activity, single elimination tournament. Rules:
The game will be played 6 on 6 (patrols may be combined if needed to make a full field).
Each patrol will have a goalie, (2) forwards, and (3) mid-fielders. • Each game will be played until one patrol scores 10 goals or a total of (2) 7-minute halves and a 1-minute half-time have been played (whichever occurs first). Clock will continue to run unless there is an injury. • Do not remove hands from hand grip. Do not lean on poles. Warnings/reminders will be issued by referee. • Do not touch the ball. Any player to do so will automatically result in rewarding opposing team with a free kick. • Do not touch any player, at any time with your hands. 1st offense = warning, 2nd offense will result in that player being removed from the court for the remainder of the game. • After each goal, the opposing team will get possession of the ball to continue play. • If the ball leaves the court, it will go to the opposing team at mid-field. • Subs are allowed at half-time, or in the case of an injured player. • Tournament Director's decisions are final.

The game is over when the time expires or 10 goals are scored.
